The [Verizon Foundation](#) offers grants to select 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations. Individuals are not eligible for the grant.

Perspective grantees must choose an area of concentration – education, literacy, domestic violence prevention, healthcare and accessibility or internet safety – with an emphasis on ‘meaningful outcomes and measureable results.’

[Grant applications](#) are considered on a rolling deadline January 1 through October 16, 2011.

Grant Helps States Respond to Juvenile Delinquency



The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) is offering the [State Juvenile Justice Formula and Block Grants Training and Technical Assistance Program](#).

The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDPA) and the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act allow OJJDP to offer this grant. The program's goals are to provide training and technical assistance to state and local juvenile justice systems and some non-profits to respond to juvenile delinquency. It will do this by helping the grantees to plan, establish, operate, coordinate and evaluate delinquency prevention. It also will help fund projects to improve juvenile justice. The grantee will get as much as \$2 million for a one-year program period. It can also be renewable for three additional years.

Internet Crimes Against Children Deconfliction System Program Grant



[Internet Crimes Against Children Deconfliction System Program Grant](#) offers assistance to organizations looking for financial help to thwart internet crimes against kids. The Internet Crimes Against Children Deconfliction Systems (ICAC) may be able to get help from OJJDP through its grant program. This grant will award as much as \$500,000 to

help construct, maintain and house an Internet Crimes Against Children Data System (IDS). The grant's purpose is to assist law enforcement investigations with child exploitations, avoid conflict on data, and enhance the ability to share information among local, state and federal ICAC task forces. This grant is available to help enhance the ability of OJJDP to collect and aggregate information on child exploitation.
